QUATERNARY PALEOENVIRONMENTS OF THE MIDDLE EAST: PROXY RECORDS, HUMAN PREHISTORY, AND REGIONAL CROSS-CORRELATION
Sponsored by the Archaeological Geology Division and the Quaternary Geology and Geomorphology Division.

Convened by Carlos E. Cordova (Oklahoma State University) and Caroline P. Davies (University of Missouri, Kansas City).

Quaternary geoscientists and geoarchaeologists working in Middle Eastern countries are invited to present and discuss paleoenvironmental records, and their application to issues of climate change chronologies, human prehistory, and regional geomorphic evolution. Other significant issues include implementation of dating techniques, correlation between seas and land and across the region.

The main goal is to have representation of as many sources of proxy data as possible as well as and representative research from as many countries as possible. Topics will vary from paleoclimatic and paleohydrologic to neotectonic activity.

In this session Middle East includes Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Israel, the Palestinian Territories, Egypt, Libya, Turkey, Cyprus, Iraq, Iran, and the countries of the Arabian Peninsula, and all of the adjacent seas. Research in neighboring countries is welcomed as long as it is relevant to the region.

PHD STUDENTSHIPS - UNIVERSITY OF SHEFFIELD

I hope that those of you who do not know me very well will forgive the intrusion, but I would like to bring to your attention two PhD studentships in palaeo-environmental/archaeological statistics. I would be very grateful if you would circulate the following to any students you think might be interested.

The Department of Probability and Statistics at the University of Sheffield has two fully funded PhD studentships in palaeo-environmental/archaeological statistics to start in October 2004. The Department has an excellent research record, a large and active group of postgraduate research students, and a highly successful taught MSc; for general background see: <http://www.shef.ac.uk/~pas/PhD/>

Since both studentships are jointly held with colleagues in archaeology, we will offer tailored training in both archaeology/environmental science and statistics depending upon the students selected.

The new projects will involve developing methodology for investigating issues of contemporaneity in palaeo-environmental and archaeological records, under an interdisciplinary supervisory team comprising Dr Caitlin Buck (Probability and Statistics, Sheffield), Dr Paul Pettitt (Archaeology, Sheffield) and Dr Andrew Millard (Archaeology, Durham).

The first of the studentships is NERC/EPSRC funded under their Environmental Mathematics and Statistics programme. It will focus on palaeo-environmental contemporaneity problems. This studentship is available to UK students only, the maintenance grant will be 16,000 pounds per annum (EU students are eligible for fees only).

The second is a University of Sheffield studentship which will focus on archaeological questions of contemporaneity. The maintenance grant for UK and EU students will be 10,500 pounds in 2004/5, rising to 12,000 from 2005/6; PLUS, for UK students only, an EPSRC "priority area" payment of 3000 pounds per annum may be available.

We are prepared to consider students from a range of academic backgrounds. Ideally, for both studentships, we seek students who have (or expect to obtain) good BSc or MSc/MMath training in mathematics/statistics. However, good BSc/MSc students with backgrounds in archaeological or environmental science may also be considered provided that they have taken some university level statistics/mathematics and have A-level mathematics at grade C or above.
