The IBA 2005 conference will cover the progress in the field, including facilities, new techniques, theory/ simulations, ion-solid interactions, applications to materials and device physics, art, archeology, medical issues, and the environment.

The special emphasis of this conference will be on *the analysis of the structure and composition of surfaces/ thin layers* and on *applications where the combination of IBA with other techniques leads to a (much) better insight into the properties of the studied system*. FIFTH INTERNATIONAL BONE DIAGENESIS MEETING

**University of Cape Town, Rondebosch, South Africa, 28-
31 August 2005**

First Announcement

The Fifth International Bone Diagenesis Meeting will be held at the University of Cape Town, Rondebosch, South Africa, 28-31 August 2005.

These interdisciplinary meetings are held every four to five years to provide a forum for the discussion of topics concerned with the preservation of bones and teeth in the archaeological and palaeontological records. The range of time periods and conditions considered is broad, ranging from immediate post-death to fossilisation processes in dinosaur bones. Apart from considerations of taphonomy, a strong focus in these meetings is on the effects of preservation and diagenesis on chemical archives related to behavioural, particularly dietary, reconstructions.

We look forward to welcoming delegates to the University of Cape Town. The campus, where the meeting will take place, is situated on the slopes of Devil's Peak and part of the Table Mountain chain. The weather at this time of the year is likely to be variable, usually rainy days are interspersed with sunny days. We plan to organise a fieldtrip immediately after the meeting, to the hominin sites of the Sterkfontein Valley.

A second announcement and call for abstracts will be sent out in September 2004 (deadline for receipt of abstracts: 31 January 2005). Provisional programme, registration and accommodation bookings will be available in February/March 2005.

PROPOSAL FOR A POSSIBLE THEMED SESSION, SAA ANNUAL MEETINGS, SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH, 2005, LITHIC REDUCTION ANALYSIS AND PROBLEMS OF PREHISTORY

Call for papers

To date the investigation of lithic reduction strategies has primarily involved the elucidation of decisions made during tool production to promote a fuller understanding of the technological choices available to prehistoric knappers and the possible reasons behind their chosen courses of action. However, detailed knowledge of reduction sequences also has the potential for shedding considerable light on a much wider array of research issues that continue to be subjects of debate. Raw material selection and acquisition, the nature of technological transitions like that which accompanied the shift from hunting and gathering to agriculture, tool use-lives and life histories, the nature of tool use as an analytical concept, problems of equifinality, typology, and even re-assessing the concept of reduction itself, are but a few issues that can be advantageously addressed via lithic reduction analysis.

The session being proposed is a venue for current research on lithic reduction strategies, and the larger cultural implications of choices made by early lithic artisans, as a means of furthering our understanding of the prehistoric past. It is an opportunity to explore the potential of reduction studies as a means to broader interpretive ends, rather than just an analytical end in and of itself. By expanding our concepts and methods we stand a much greater chance of refining our perceptions about past cultural dynamics and the people that drove them.

Geographic and temporal foci are open, and will only be limited by the scope of abstracts/papers submitted.

Palaeo-climate archive studies with cosmogenic isotopes

An experienced and energetic experimental scientist is sought to conduct independent and team-based research in the field of paleo-climate change related to applications of C-14 in the study of atmospheric and oceanic processes during the Holocene and late Quaternary. This work will primarily be based on measurement of C-14 in such archives as corals, (including modern coral records for ENSO), speleothems and tree-rings preformed at our ANTARES Accelerator Mass Spectrometry Facility. He or she will be a member of a new multi-faceted ANSTO project called CcASH-Cosmogenic climate Archives in the Southern Hemisphere. This activity is supported through university collaborations and institutional agreements and is focussed on applications of cosmogenic radionuclides (such a Be-10, Al-26 and C-14) to investigate climate variability, landscape evolution, glacial geochronology and ocean circulation in the Southern Hemisphere. The successful applicant will be expected to drive their own scientific research program and participate in other aspects of the project. The position requires knowledge in the role of C-14, Be-10, stable isotope (eg d18O, d13C) geochemistry and U-Th series dating to palaeo-climate studies, experience in relevant sample preparation techniques and familiarity with methods in AMS measurement of cosmogenic radionuclides.

ΑΝΑΚΟΙΝΩΣΕΙΣ - ANNOUNCEMENTS

THE AUSTRALIAN, 50 ANCIENT TOMBS UNCOVERED, FROM CORRESPONDENTS IN ATHENS, JULY 18, 2004

ARCHEOLOGISTS have discovered 50 tombs dating back to the late Minoan period, around 1400 BC, and containing a number of artifacts on the Greek island of Crete, ANA news agency reported today.

The tombs were part of the once powerful ancient city of Kydonia, which was destroyed at the time but later rebuilt.

The oldest among them contained bronze weapons, jewellery and vases and are similar to the tombs of fallen soldiers of the Mycenaean type from mainland Greece, said the head of the excavations, Maria Vlazaki.

The more recent family tombs are of a more traditional Kydonia type.

Earlier excavations in the area in northwest Crete near the town of Chania had already yielded some 100 burial sites.
