## **2005 BOSTON UNIVERSITY** **ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD SCHOOL**

The Boston University Mediterranean Archaeological Field School at the site of Torre d'en Galmes on the Island of Menorca will take place. The program will consist of a six-week excavation campaign combined with lectures, work in the museum and laboratories, and study tours of the island's cultural and historical monuments. Students will enroll for two four-credit courses: AR 503 Archaeological Field Methods and AR 511 Studies in European Archaeology.

The island of Menorca, the easternmost of Spain's three Balearic Islands, is located nearly midway between Spain and Sardinia, and between France and North Africa. It has played an important role in the history of the western Mediterranean, from the time it was first inhabited (ca. 2500 B.C.), through the Punic and Roman periods (from the 4th century B.C. to the 4th century A.D.), the Palaeochristian and Arab periods (5th through 13th centuries A.D.), and into the modern historical periods.

The field school will be based in Mahón, an attractive port city that is the modern capital of Menorca. The site of Torre d'en Gaumes, located near Mahón, belongs to the indigenous Talayotic culture of Menorca. It has some of the characteristic constructions of the culture: three talayots (large circular towers) and a taula precinct (T-shaped megalithic building).

The Boston University Archaeological Field School on Menorca will work in collaboration with the Museum of Menorca. Boston University Field Participants will excavate a series of underground structures, which will supply crucial new information about the island's Talayotic history, especially from the early Iron Age through the Roman period.

Students will receive an intensive introduction to all aspects of field excavation techniques, from methods of discovery and recovery to documentation, including the creation of site plans and the use of the Harris Matrix for recording stratigraphy. In the museum laboratory, students will process excavated material and will be trained in the basic techniques of artifact recording and illustration.

As you possibly know the original deadline was January 31, 2005, and we have managed to collect around 250 abstracts, which is more than satisfactory result. On the other hand, several authors asked us if it would be possible to submit their abstracts some time later and they also mentioned, that they had not enough time to spread the information about ICEE 2005 among educators and researchers possibly interested in this event. In view of this wide interest in ICEE 2005, and our own attitude towards making this event as broad and rich in engineering education and research achievements reports as possible, we have decided to once extend the abstract submission deadline. We are sure that this decision would allow us to make ICEE 2005 conference in Gliwice substantially more interesting, important and successful, and we seek your help in accomplishing this mission. We would like to ask you to submit your abstract **as soon as possible** because it helps us in the **ICEE 2005 planning** and makes it possible to earlier inform you about your abstract acceptance.

We would like to use this occasion to share with you some data concerning the shaping of ICEE 2005 in Gliwice. With respect to the country oriented statistics of the abstracts submitted so far, we observe traditionally strong participation of colleagues from United States, Taiwan and Brazil. We can expect important representation from United Kingdom, Czech Republic, Germany, Spain and Australia universities. We would like to stress that we are impressed by the number of abstracts that we have collected from such countries as Russia, Ukraine, Lithuania and Romania. We hoped that the organization of ICEE 2005 in Poland would enable to get more participants from these Central and Eastern Europe countries and it seems that we were right. As for now we have collected **abstracts from people representing 38 countries!** With respect to the categories of highest interest for ICEE 2005 participants we should mention current trends in engineering education, e-learning, internet technologies and multimedia, as well as special topics on computer graphics and graphics education. The latter topic has been specially prepared for ICEE 2005 in Gliwice with the world-wide **community of Geometry and Graphics educators** in mind. We have also observed substantial interest in such important topics as collaboration with industry, internationalization and globalization of education, biotechnology and special topics on physics in engineering education and elements of ethics while educating engineers. We would like to stress once again that we expect abstracts and subsequent presentations on any engineering education and research related topic, and even if you cannot find the thematic category that directly corresponds to your area of specialization please do not hesitate to submit your

contribution.

We would like to repeat our invitation to participate in the ICEE 2005, organized by the Silesian University of Technology in Gliwice, Poland, July 25-29, 2005. Please refer to the ICEE 2005 website - <http://icee2005.polsl.pl> - for major topics and special sessions of the conference, and remember that the general objective of ICEE conferences is the promotion of international networking and collaboration. We would like also to remind you that together with the rich technical program of the conference we would like you to visit some of the truly lovely and interesting places in the south of Poland, including the unique industrial infrastructure of Upper Silesia region, the magnificent monuments of Kraków - one of the oldest and the most beautiful towns in Poland, and the absolutely special salt mine in Wieliczka. The accompanying persons program includes among other the possibility of important **visit to Auschwitz** which could be also made available to regular conference participants via special arrangement.

We look forward to meet you in Gliwice in July.

## **First Circular**

The Middle Helladic period is caught between two peaks of economic growth and cultural achievement: the Early Bronze Age and the Mycenaean period. In addition, the Greek mainland generally receives less attention than the contemporary and more sophisticated Aegean maritime polities or palatial Crete. However, it is becoming increasingly apparent that the MH period witnessed important social, political and cultural changes that lead to the formation of the early Mycenaean polities and the later palatial states.

For this reason, we decided to organize a conference dedicated exclusively to the MH period. The main aims of the conference are to assess the state of our knowledge and to explore the causes and consequences of the changes taking place during the period. Naturally our focus will be on the MH period, but we are also interested in the transitional phases (EH III, LH I). Although our main interest is in the core areas, i.e. the central and southern mainland, we would like to include relevant papers dealing with interaction and cultural interdependence with neighbouring areas (e.g. northern Greece, the Balkans, the islands of the Aegean and Crete, the central and eastern Mediterranean). We welcome papers on recent discoveries and excavation results as long as they raise issues relevant to the themes of the conference. Shorter contributions may also be presented in the form of posters.

These are the themes we would like to address during the conference:

- Chronology (ceramic sequences and synchronisms)
- Settlement form and organization and their relation to social structure
- Ritual and mortuary practices
- Economy (agriculture and animal husbandry, diet, craft production)
- Demographic questions
- Trade, exchange and cultural interaction
- Demographic questions
- Changes in sociopolitical structure

The official languages of the conference are English, French and Greek. Participants will be allotted 20 minutes for presentation to allow time for discussion. The Proceedings of the conference will appear as a *Supplément* of the *BCH*, published by the French School at Athens.

The conference will cover accommodation for the speakers. We hope we will be in the position to cover the speakers' travel costs as well. However, as our funds are limited, we would like to ask you to apply for financial support in the first instance to your own institution.

*Experts know of more than 1,000 wrecks in Greek waters,  
all vulnerable to looting by antiquities thieves.*

Concern over fate of antiquities lying on the seabed  
**New bill does little to dispel experts' looting fears**

When a few months ago a leading light in the field of underwater exploration, Robert Ballard, visited Athens, he warned Greeks to guard their wrecks as if he knew what was coming.

A bill just released by the Merchant Marine Ministry on underwater diving appears to have raised the more general issue of protecting antiquities in Greek waters.

The draft legislation bans recreational diving at underwater archaeological sites. However, the problem is that there are not only specifically designated sites but many others that have not yet been delineated. And because this is Greece, there is no guarantee of protection since the state is not in a position to check the looting of antiquities.

The majority of archaeologists have taken issue with the provisions of the bill, as have several environmental organizations such as the Hydra Ecologists' Association "Hydran Seal," the Society of Greek Archaeologists and even professional fishermen who claim the bill will be the coup de grace for their industry. The Environment and Sustainability Chamber recently held a two-day conference to air all their existing reservations about the ministry's bill on "recreational diving."

As concern mounts, given the fact that Greece resembles an entire unguarded maritime museum, more groups are joining in the protests against the bill, and the issue has gone from the Greek to the European Parliament.

Naturally, the seabed is not an easy place to protect archaeological treasures. For example, in recent years the Underwater Antiquities Ephorate, in cooperation with the Hellenic Center for Marine Research, has found 25 wrecks, but experts know there are more than 1,000 in Greek waters. The seabed cannot be guarded in the same way as antiquities on land; ancient wrecks and their cargoes are at the mercy of anyone who knows how to dive. There have been attempts to loot a wreck containing sarcophagi near Methoni, the wreck at Porto Koufo on Alonissos, the post-Byzantine wreck of Nisyros, a Byzantine wreck off Kastellorizo and another off Antiparos, among others.

A statue retrieved by fishermen from the seabed off Kythnos three months ago could have fallen into other hands, as occurred with the “Saarbrücken” statue that has been returned to Greece and is now on exhibit in the National Archaeological Museum.

Critics of the bill also warn that new technology, including the use of bathyscapes, has heightened the risk of illegal activities in Greece’s seas.

Among the more general issues raised by archaeologists, and one which should concern the Culture Ministry, is whether the Merchant Marine Ministry’s coast guard service has enough staff to police not only Greece’s underwater archaeology but its ecosystems.
